City Awaiting Notification Regarding River Parkways Grant: With great anticipation, City Staff awaits news regarding the California River Parkway Grant application submitted last October. In a collaborative effort, Peggy Mandeville, Principal Transportation Planner, Neil Havlik, Natural Resources Manager, Amy Lopez, Administration and Community Development Intern, and Phil Dunsmore, Associate Planner, crafted the application for approximately \$900,000 to fund construction of a bicycle and pedestrian trail along Prefumo Creek between Oceanaire Drive and Calle Joaquin and to fund vegetation enhancements throughout that riparian corridor. Staff hoped to receive notification from the California Natural Resources Agency by early 2012, but an adjustment to project prioritization at the Agency has pushed the call-back date to mid-summer. With \$30 million available to fund projects and 283 applications submitted, staff is confident in the strength of the project proposed in its application and remains excited for the opportunity to build this critical segment of the Bob Jones City-to-Sea Trail. Measure Y- Microsurfacing Summer 2011: After five months of work, the 2012 Microsurfacing project is finally complete. Black Bond Black Top microsurfaced a total of 331,000 square yards of road and restriped several portions of major streets in town, including Higuera, Broad and Santa Rosa Streets.

The removal and replacement of 159 feet of curb and gutter on Lawrence Drive was also included in this project. This replacement will alleviate the poor street drainage caused by damage from a tree to the prior curb and gutter.



Routine maintenance of microsurfacing is highly recommended to postpone more expensive reconstruction work for a significant period of time. Repairs of the curb and gutter will reduce water ponding and extend the service life of the paving surface.

The project's estimated total cost was \$953, 200, funded by Measure Y, the half-cent sales tax City residents approved.
