WHAT YOU'LL DO

The Water Resource Recovery Facility Supervisor will plan, coordinate, manage, review, and evaluate all Water Resource Recovery Facility (WRRF) operations, maintenance, recycled water production, and effluent disposal activities in compliance with federal, state and local water, biosolids and air quality regulations.

Key priorities of this position:

- Effectively manage a motivated and dedicated team in operating a state-of-the-art facility in the production of water, generation of energy, creation of biosolids for beneficial reuse and protection of the environment.
- Collaborate with others on the best practices of regional resource management including water production, water quality, potable reuse and on-going compliance.
- Engage the community and partner with stakeholders to create and maintain an asset that supports education, training, and public interests. Be a good neighbor and example to other communities of the possibilities that the Water Resource Recovery Facility provides.




WHERE YOU'LL WORK

The City of San Luis Obispo is an authentic live, work and play community, featuring:

- 47,000 residents (which doubles during the daytime), 315 days of sunshine per year, and the 4th lowest commute time in the U.S.
- A geographic location only ten minutes from the Pacific Ocean
- A full slate of services, including police, fire, water, wastewater, transit and parking
- A bus system with 1 million riders and a recognized Bike Friendly Community
- One of the largest ongoing Farmers' Market in the nation (Thursday night)
- A nationally renowned Skate Park
- A nationally ranked technical university, Cal Poly San Luis Obispo

The City's Water Resource Recovery Facility (WRRF) is a 5.1 MGD tertiary plant that accepts wastewater from the City of San Luis Obispo, Cal Poly and the County Airport. The WRRF will begin a 3-year construction project in May of 2019 to increase capacity to meet future needs, install a Membrane Bioreactor (MBR) and UV disinfection for regulatory requirements and maximize recycled water production for our community. This project embraces environmental, social and economic objectives to ensure an exciting and balanced community asset for our citizens and regional community.



WHAT YOU'LL NEED

The successful candidate for the position of Water Resource Recovery Facility Supervisor will:

- Be an effective communicator and excel in shepherding organizational growth and change.
- Have possession and maintenance of a Grade IV Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator Certification (Grade V highly desirable).
- Have at least three years of experience operating and performing maintenance on facilities and equipment in a secondary or tertiary wastewater treatment/resource recovery plant, including one year at a supervisory level or shift lead.
- Have knowledge of the operation, cleaning and preventative maintenance of wastewater treatment, water resource recovery and disposal facilities and equipment.
- Have knowledge of energy management and facility optimization.
- Possess a relentless service ethic and a high level of personal accountability.

WHAT SLO HAS TO OFFER

The City offers a competitive salary (between \$85,904 and \$107,328 per year based on qualifications and experience) and an attractive benefits package, including:

- Health Insurance: Medical, dental, vision, and supplemental life available, with a City contribution of up to \$1,472 when you enroll your family in medical.
- Retirement: CalPERS Classic Members are enrolled in the 2% at 60 formula; New Members are enrolled in the 2% at 62 formula. The City does not participate in Social Security.
- Long Term Disability and Life Insurance: 2/3 of salary up to \$11,250 per month (maximum benefit is \$7,500) and a \$100,000 life insurance policy.
- Schedules & Time Away from Work: Enjoy the "SLO Life," a 9/80 work schedule, 12 days of vacation per year increasing to 20 days after 20 years, 12 days of sick leave annually, 48 hours of administrative leave annually, and 13 paid holidays.
- Professional Development: Participation in professional organizations and conferences is encouraged as is the City's Leadership and Learning Academy offering supervisory and leadership academies. Tuition reimbursement up to \$1,500 per year is also available.
